POLICY: *All eligible persons and/or their guardian will have the opportunity to choose an affiliated Targeted Case Management (TCM) provider.*

GUIDELINES:

- a. An individual seeking new or a different TCM Agency may contact the CDDO for assistance at any time. Upon notification, a CDDO Representative or TCM will provide to the individual and/or guardian the Targeted Case Management Affiliate list to identify the case management providers open for referrals. The CDDO will provide the person with all their options for TCM services including working with the current TCM provider to resolve any concerns, or selecting TCM services from a different provider.
- b. Upon identification of a new TCM provider the current TCM provider will be informed in writing of the request for change in compliance with the Agreement of Service Exit Protocol (06-009-002). The current TCM or CDDO Representative will complete the Service Provider Choice Form (06-013.002) and upload into the BCI web based system.
- c. The current TCM provider or Representative will cooperate in exchanging all necessary documentation to assure a smooth transition of services. All transition documentation as approved by HIPAA standards will be exchanged at the time of the transition meeting. Transition meetings are required as specified in CDDO policy 06-009.
- d. The current TCM is required to submit the Service Provider Transition Checklist (06-009-001) and the CDDO Status Action Form (06-008.002) in the BCI web based system.
- e. Any person can notify the CDDO of any concerns, issues or complaints surrounding the decision to change TCM providers or of a violation of CDDO policy 06-014.
- f. Changes in TCM providers will be tracked by the CDDO.
