POLICY: *The Shawnee County Community Developmental Disabilities Organization (CDDO) will implement a plan, developed in coordination with the Shawnee County CDDO's Affiliates, that results in services being offered and provided in a way that does not discriminate against any person because of the severity of each person's disability.*

GUIDELINES:

1. TARC Inc., designated as the CDDO for Shawnee County, shall enter into contractual agreements with entities interested in providing I/DD Services in Shawnee County.
2. Mutual contractual Affiliation Agreements may allow an entity to specialize in services. Specialization in services will be indicated in the specific contractual agreements and Shawnee County Affiliated Provider list.
3. Affiliated providers will not deny services based upon severity of the disability per the CDDO Affiliate Agreement.
4. Affiliated providers will be required to provide services in relation to the Affiliated providers' capacity methodology.
5. The CDDO shall assist in establishing and identifying Affiliates to provide services and supports to individuals with I/DD when gaps and/or barriers exist.
6. The CDDO in consultation with Affiliated providers can only refuse to serve a person who is determined by the State of Kansas to be inappropriate for community services. Documentation or Article 63 must determine the person presents a clear and present danger to self or to others in the community.
7. If an Affiliated provider refuses to provide services to an individual, they must submit to the CDDO and applicant, in writing, the reasons why the determination was made.
8. If a person feels he/she has been discriminated against with regard to provision of services, the person may utilize the CDDO's Dispute Resolution Policy [06-020](#).
