- The CDDO currently has 43 individuals on the Targeted Case Management (TCM) waiting list. A couple of TCM providers opened to take a few individuals off the waiting list.
- The CDDO is in the process of reviewing policies. The Council is responsible for reviewing CDDO Policies #06-018, 06-019 and 06-026. The committee began reviewing Policy #06-018 and will continue at the next meeting.
- There is some concern as to what information providers are requesting when an individual and/or guardian is interested in their services. This can be unfair to some individuals who are denied access to their services due to behavioral concerns or higher support needs. Some agencies seem to pick and choose who they want in their services. KDADS has questioned why an individual was denied services when the provider is showing open to new referrals. In the past, a referral was sent out to a provider and their team would meet to figure out what supports were needed and if any special accommodations were required to help the individual be successful.
- Capacity remains a concern as eligibility numbers continue to increase. Recruitment of individuals who reside in our State Institutions/Hospitals or jails/prisons with high behavioral needs who end up back in jail, and when released, the provider states they can no longer support the individual.
